
## Christmas Around the World Alejandra Sigala

Paddington is a heartwarming and funny movie about a very polite bear who improves the lives of everyone he meets, showing us the value of opening our hearts to those different from ourselves.







Las posadas empiezan el 16 de diciembre y acaban el 24 de diciembre. Durante las posadas hay 9 familias que se comprometen a tener la posada, en la posada se dan dulces, comida, bebidas y también celebran pinatas. Unas familias ponen árboles de Navidad, pero es muy común que pongan un nacimiento. Finalmente se ponen las figuras de los 3 reyes magos en el 6 de Enero.

Antes de el rosario, hay una comida para comer. Los platos populares para la comida navideña principal incluye Pozole (una sopa espesa hecha con maíz, pollo o cerdo y chiles cubiertos con verduras), pavo asado, cerdo asado, tamales, bacalao, romeritos (una verdura verde que se cocina en salsa mole con papas y gambas) y normalmente se sirven ensaladas como acompañamiento como Ensalada Nochebuena (Ensalada de Nochebuena). De postre los buñuelos son muy populares, son tortillas de harina fritas espolvoreados

con azúcar y canela o un almíbar de azúcar caliente. ¡Los buñuelos vienen en dos

formas planas y redondas! Para beber, puede haber Ponche (un ponche caliente de Navidad hecho con frutas) y Rompope (juna bebida como el ponche de huevo al que a menudo se le agrega ron!).

En la noche de Navidad todos los niños esperan que el Niño Dios les de regalos.
